Who may apply for the stipend?

Any New York City residents in their freshman, sophomore or junior years of college may apply.

How much is the stipend?

Each student will receive \$525 per week of full time work, plus unlimited MetroCards (or equivalent value). Internships are 10-weeks long, \$5250 for the length of their summer internship.
